An Independent Visitor is a volunteer who can be friend and support you during your time in care.

WHAT IS AN INDEPENDENT VISITOR?

An Independent Visitor is someone who is independent from your social worker and support staff. They will visit you on a regular basis and be a source of support when you need it.

An Independent Visitor is interested in you and **you only**. They will help and guide you during your time in care and be someone you can trust and talk to.



Independent Visitors are not professionals. They do not work for Social Services, the police, your local council or your care placement.

They are people who are there to support and help you. They are not paid to be there, they are there because they want to be.

You can ask your Independent Visitor anything or talk to them about what's on your mind. Independent Visitors are real people with real life experiences and can be very interesting people to talk to. Sometimes we call them 'role models' because they can inspire and motivate you.



WHAT'S IN IT FOR YOU?

Your Independent Visitor will:

- Visit you on a regular basis
- Talk to you about things you are interested in
- Listen to you about anything whether it's a funny story or something more serious
- Respect you and not judge you
- Support your hobbies and interests and help you develop new ones
- Support your future and help you achieve the things that matter to you
- Be completely separate from social services or care homes
- Be someone who will help you during difficult or confusing times

Your Independent Visitor will have been carefully matched to you based on their hobbies and interests.
